Please note that school fee arrangements made in 2016 do not automatically continue. This includes those families that have automatic payments deducted from Centrelink.

If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete a Statement of Financial Position so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

N.B. If you were on a payment arrangement for 2016 (except Flexible Payment Plan) it is important that you contact me when you receive your Term 1 statement so that I am aware of your intentions for 2017.

This carpark is set aside for staff, the parish and disabled students. We still have a number of parents parking in this carpark before and after school.


This has become very frustrating and dangerous particularly for our disabled students and their parents, and elderly parish members who are working with Fr Mick, when no spots can be found.

Some parents are even leaving children in the car with the motor running as they rush inside to collect their children.


The actions of these parents are of serious concern, as it displays complete disregard for the safety of their own children let alone those of our students who are walking through the carpark to reach Troy Street.

It is disappointing that again we will have to reinstate the chain and no entry sign at the entrance to the carpark.








A note from the President
