FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

One of the great 'buzz' phrases at the moment is GROWTH MINDSET. In education new buzz words and ideas are constantly coming through, but this one has some credit. We hear in the media that there is a great need to build the resilience of our children and as teachers we often have the same conversations. At Our Lady of the Way we talk about needing to take risks in our learning, to be comfortable with 'hard thinking' and working in the 'learning pit'. All of this is very challenging for children if they haven't developed a growth mindset to learning. So what do I mean by this? Individuals who believe their talents can be developed (through hard work, good strategies, and input from others) have a growth mindset. They tend to achieve more than those with a more fixed mindset (those who believe their talents are innate gifts). So what are we doing here at OLOW and what can you do as parents to help your children to develop a growth mindset?

Our teachers across the school talk about what having a growth mindset looks like and how we can 'flip our thinking' from a fixed mindset to one of growth. This is something that parents can also do at home. This can help those children who feel that something is too hard, or that they are just not good at something. There is one very powerful word that we can use and that is the word "YET". I'm not good at writing <u>yet</u>." We can then add: "If I _____ this will help me to become better at ____.". Below are some images of Growth mindset prompts in some of our classrooms. I wonder if you noticed any of them during celebrations of learning on Monday.

Cyber Safety ~ Warning about MOMO

It prompts children to complete dares, not speak to adults and is threatening and scaring children. They are then bringing this to school which is affecting their learning. We are you to do: be vigilant at home and perhaps have a conversation with your child about this not being true and that you must always talk to an adult if you feel unsafe.













Look what we have been reading in our Library!


