Dear Our Lady of the Way Community

In light of recent events in New Zealand, we could not be blamed for asking why tragedy is never far from our consciousness. The daily news is also often filled with instances of fear and distrust. When added to the personal tragedies in our own lives, who would blame us from asking "Where is God in this?"

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear the parable of the fig tree. The message around this is that of not really knowing what is happening but trusting in God. We never know exactly what is happening for the fig tree underground or why it is not bearing fruit at that moment in time. Perhaps the tree has some type of fungus or disease in the soil. Then again, maybe there was growth occurring underground in the root system and this could not be seen. What we need to remember is that although it was not bearing fruit or flourishing at that moment in time, it was still alive. Often our lives can feel like this, we feel flat or question why things are happening in our lives, we also are not flourishing. At these times we need to be like the worker in the vineyard, In spite of the fact that we are flat out trying to get through every day, we need to find time to see the potential in every situation. Sr Hilda Scott (OSB) articulates this so well " God is the Gardener who trusts the process of growing; trusts us, grasps what others do not, sees potential, and gives us another chance - and there is no limit with God. He sees what is lacking and is keen to provide it. All he, and we, need is an openness in us to see it through.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Last week our school community stood together with schools all around Australia to say NO WAY to BULLYING. Students and their teachers spoke about the effects of bullying on people and some of the causes behind what makes people act in this way. One of the main areas of focus was how to be an UPSTANDER rather BYSTANDER. A BYSTANDER, although not the instigator or actor behind bullying behaviours, sits back and watches or allows these behaviours to occur. In many circumstances this can be, unintentionally, a support to the person acting in this way. An UPSTANDER, steps in and does something to stop or prevent the bullying behaviours. This could include speaking directly to the person and 'standing up' to the person acting unkindly, it could be distracting the person and changing the behaviours or it could be going to get help. Here are some tips that we shared with the children about what to do when bullying behaviours occur. At all times we separate the BEHAVIOURS from the PERSON. It is the behaviours we want to stop and change, we always respect and act with compassion to the person. We all walk around with invisible scars and it is our job to love one another, as Jesus taught us and as our school motto directs us:

Act Justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with our God.

As the adults in your children's lives, it is our job as parents, carers and teachers to model **acts of kindness** in the way we act and speak with each other. May they look to our example of how to show compassion and respect to their peers, family and members of the school community.

Student tips about bullying

If it happens in person, try these:

- ignore them (try not to show any reaction)
- tell them to stop and then walk away
- pretend you don't care
- go somewhere safe
- get support from your friends.

Different things work for different types of bullying.

If it happens online, try these:

- avoid responding to the bullying
- block and report anyone who is bullying online
- protect yourself online – use privacy settings and keep records.

If you see someone being bullied:

- leave negative online conversations – don't join in
- support others being bullied.

If it doesn't stop:

- talk to an adult (parent, teacher) who can help stop the bullying
- keep asking for support until the bullying stops.




MYSTERY OF THE WHISPERING TREES
