Last Sunday marked the end of the Easter
Liturgical Season. Our Holy Father, Pope
Francis in his address to the congregation on
Pentecost Sunday reminded us that although
sin separates us from God, we haven't been



left as orphans, but that thanks to Jesus Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit, we can reconcile with the Lord and continue to live as his children.

"The central purpose of Jesus' mission, which culminated in the gift of the Holy Spirit, was to renew our relationship with the Father, a relationship severed by sin, to take us from our state of being orphaned children and to restore us as his sons and daughters".

"We were made to be God's children, it is in our DNA," he said, explaining "the Spirit is given to us by the Father and leads us back to the Father."

Pentecost is often referred to as the "Birthday". Usually at a birthday we would receive gifts, Pentecost is the same but these gifts come from the Holy Spirit. Each year the celebration of Pentecost gives us a chance to remember that this life-giving gift continues to flow in our lives. We are renewed, refreshed, and revived.

I ask that you continue to pray for Max Selby (Kindergarten) who continues to fight for his life in Westmead Children's hospital. Please keep his family in your thoughts and prayers so that they stay strong and find strength in Jesus for their beautiful little boy.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES

- NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all volunteers</u> and contractors <u>complete an online undertaking form</u> that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

• Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' or access the form via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage http://www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on 'Child Protection Training Forms' (halfway down page on the right hand side).

Then click on 'Volunteer Form' (halfway down page).

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are volunteering.

AFTERNOON DISMISSAL


Please note that once children are dismissed for the day, they need to choose one of the following options. At no time are children allowed to leave the school grounds on their own accord. Children are not permitted to wait for their parents out on the street.



- 1. **Bus Line and Forbes Street Walkers** Children assemble in front of the Staff Space in the Infant's playground. A teacher will accompany children to Forbes Street where they will be put on the relevant bus, or released to walk home.
- 2. **Troy Street and Mackay Street Walkers** Children assemble in front of the Year 1 classroom. A teacher will accompany children out of the school grounds to either Troy or Mackay Street
- 3. **Parent Collection** If parents wish to collect their children personally, children can meet them at a designated place within the school grounds.
- 4. **Uncollected Children** Will be asked to sit on the silver seats outside the office until their parent/carer arrives.

SCHOLASTIC BOOKCLUB - A NOTE ABOUT ONLINE ORDERING (LOOP)



Online ordering for Bookclub is open and available for use as soon as students receive the catalogue from school, however the orders are held at Scholastic until the 'due by' date that is stamped on the front of the catalogue, at which point all the orders are released and sent to the school in bulk. This delivery includes all online LOOP orders as well as cash orders sent into the school office. Delivery is usually within a week of the 'due by' date.

Fourth Bishop of Parramatta Appointed





His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed Most Rev Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFM Conv DD, as the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Parramatta. He has been Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Melbourne since 2011.

On Thursday 16 June 2016, the Liturgical Reception and Solemn Mass of Installation of Bishop Vincent will take place at 7.30pm in St Patrick's Cathedral in Parramatta.

Bishop Vincent was born in 1961 in Gia-Kiem, Vietnam. He and his family came to Australia as refugees in 1980.

After his ordination to the priesthood on 30 December 1989, Bishop Vincent went to Rome for further studies and was awarded a licentiate in Christology and Spirituality from the Pontifical Faculty of St Bonaventure.

He was elected superior of the Order of Friars Minor Conventuals in Australia in 2005.

The Diocesan Administrator, Very Rev Peter G Williams, warmly welcomed Bishop Vincent's appointment. "Bishop Vincent is no stranger to the Diocese of Parramatta. As a Conventual Franciscan Friar, he was Parish Priest of Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville," Fr Peter said.

"We look forward to welcoming him at his formal installation in St Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta, at a date that will be set in the near future.

"I ask you to pray for Bishop Vincent as he concludes his ministry in the Archdiocese of Melbourne and assumes leadership of the Diocese of Parramatta."

About the Diocese of Parramatta

The Diocese of Parramatta is the Catholic Church in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

It spans one of the fastest-growing areas of Australia, incorporating the greater Western Sydney area from Parramatta to Blackheath in the Blue Mountains and from Richmond to Warragamba. It is home to 330,000 Catholics in an area of 1,050,000 people.

The Diocese hosts 47 parishes and churches, educates more than 45,000 students in more than 83 schools, employs more than 5,000 staff and cares for thousands of people in need through its social services arm.

The Diocese of Parramatta is the fifth-largest Catholic Diocese in Australia.



School Zone Safety

Unsafe behaviour while driving and parking in a school zone can put children's lives at risk. Increased fines and loss of demerit points apply when certain offences are committed in an operating school zone.



No Stopping

You must not stop your vehicle on a length of road or in an area in which a NO STOPPING Sign applies.

No Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.



No Parking

You are allowed to stop your vehicle only to set down or pick passengers, or goods.

Your vehicle must not stop for more than 2 minutes. The driver must not be more than 3 meters from the vehicle.



Bus Zone

You must not stop or park your vehicle in a bus zone for any reason.

This includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

Penalty \$319 + 2 Demerit Points

Penalty \$177 + 2 Demerit Points

Pedestrian Crossing

You must not stop or park your vehicle on or near a pedestrian crossing to drop off or pick up.



Double Parking


You must not stop your vehicle or park in the middle of the road to drop off or pick up.



Parking on a footpath

You must not park on or across a footpath to drop off or pick up

Penalty \$425 + 2 Demerit Points



Penalty \$177 + 2 Demerit Points



Parking near driveways

You must not park across driveways.

When parking near a driveway, ensure your vehicle is not blocking access for residents entering or exiting their properties.

Penalty \$177 + 2 points
