Students in these grades will complete an online test during Term 3. The students will answer a series of multiple choice questions related to their learning in Religious Education.

In addition, Year 4 students will complete a variety of learning tasks related to the Religious Education unit, **Reconciliation: God's Forgiveness and Healing**. Their achievement in completing these tasks will be formally assessed.

A report based on students' completion of these assessments will be forwarded to parents in Term 4.

## **MATHEMATICS AT OLOW**

## What do we teach your children in Mathematics?

We teach what is outlined for each grade according to the new NSW Mathematics Syllabus.

#### **Mental Maths**

Mental Maths is made up of two parts:

- 1. Development and use of strategies for calculating mentally
- 2. Recall of number facts with fluency

The new syllabus stresses that children who make use of metal strategies are 'working mathematically' and thinking about numbers rather than remembering procedures or answering by rote.


#### **Current Terminology**

For parents, understanding the current terminology involved in Mathematics can be tricky. Some terms and their meanings are presented below.

**Number Busting** - Breaking a number down through an operation. 144 might be 72 x 2 or 3 x 48 or 288/2 or 1/3 of 432 or 68 + 76

**Known Facts** – knowledge children have that springs immediately to mind e.g. children automatically know that 7 + \_\_ = 10, that the missing number is 3 and do not need to write it out or use concrete materials, etc. to work it out.

**Think Boards** – often the teachers will present the real life situation and the children complete the Concrete Materials, Symbol and Picture sections.





**Triads** – where the children think about numbers and look at the language – the words to describe that number, what it looks like with concrete materials like counters, and how it is written or recorded.

## Here are some common strategies used by children

## Addition and subtraction

Strategy	Example	
Commutativity	2 + 9. 9 + 2 is easier	
Counting on or back	9 + 2, 9, 10, 11	
Bridging ten	8+5: $8+2=10$ , $10+3=13$	
Doubles	6+6=12	
Near Doubles	6 + 7 = 12 + 1	
Changing subtraction to addition	9 - 7: 7 + ? = 9	

## Multiplication and division

Commutativity	$3 \times 8: 8 \times 3 = 24$	
Skip counting	4 × 5: 5, 10, 15, 20	
Repeated addition	$4 \times 5$ : 5 & 5 is 10 & 5 more is 15 and another 5 is 20	
Splitting into parts	$7 \times 4$ : $5 \times 4$ makes 20 and double 4 is 8 so the answer is 28	
Convert to Multiplication	$18 \div 3: 3 \times 6 \text{ is } 18$	
Repeated subtraction	18 ÷ 3: 18, 15, 12, 9, 6, 3, 0	
Repeated addition	18 ÷ 3: 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18	
Counting back	6 ÷ 3: 5, 4, 3 2, 1, 0	
Counting on	6 ÷ 3: 1, 2, 3 4, 5, 6
