

#### **ATTENDANCE - EVERY LEARNER - EVERY DAY**

At *Our Lady of the Way*, we continue to promote positive student attendance. Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day. Regular school attendance plays a *critical role* in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities. When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.



Our school average this week is **87.7%**, which is **below** the CEDP target of 90%. *Congratulations to Kindergarten, Year 4 and Year 6 who continue to display excellent attendance.* We love seeing all our students at school!

Absence Explanation Note: If your child is away from school, a note explaining their absence is required within 7 days of returning to school. If no note is received the absence is recorded as 'unexplained'. Parents can use the Skoolbag app to email an absence note to school.

Partial Absences (PA) are recorded for each child every time they are late to school or leave early from school. Partial Absence from school does add up to time away from learning, settling into routines of the day or saying goodbye at the end of the day. It is important that all children are at school by 8:45am when our school day starts. A Partial Absence is recorded from this time and an explanation is required by parents or a carer when being signed in through the Office.

#### SCHOOL LEAVERS

We are planning for the 2019 school year and to help us with this please let the office know if your family will not be continuing at OLOW in 2019. A reminder to families that a term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing MUST be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term and where appropriate notice has been received, a pro-rata credit will be calculated. Where a term's notice has not been given to the principal, the term's school fees will be charged for your child/children.

#### SCHOOL OPAL CARDS

School Bus Opal Card School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018. Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification. Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition, which is due to, expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply. Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply. If students need to update their information or reapply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails.

#### Parental controls for iPads and iPhones

Supporting children with their use of devices is a growing area of difficulty for parents in the home. Technology is everywhere, including in our classrooms and there are many positives to technology use. It supports student learning, provides access to the world and keeps us connected. However, more and more research is being done about the effect of screen time, particularly before bedtime, and its negative effect on sleep patterns for both children and adults. As parents and educators of pre-adolescent children, we have the added concern about the access our children have to apps and websites that they are not developmentally ready for.

A technologically savvy parent at OLOW recently shared a way that they are helping their family with managing screen time and access to various apps.

The latest Apple update to Version 12 removes the restrictions setting. It has been replaced with a new setting called *SCREENTIME*.

This setting allows you to set limits to the amount of screentime your child has access

It provides a number of different age limits for accessing apps

Parents can set apps that are available all of the time, for example educational apps and restrict access to other apps

It has stricter levels of security for use

#### 2019 PARRAMATTA DIOCESAN TEAM SPORT TRIALS

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> October as these trials will be held in November 2018. All OTHER sport registrations will open in November for 2019 trials. Any primary students enrolled in Years 5 and 6 in 2019 are invited to participate in the **Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials** during Term Four in 2018 and Term One & Two in 2019.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2019 be invited to attend.


Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports: AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), Touch (B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials, an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au.

This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2019 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria; therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed. Please note that your online registration is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY and MUST be approved by the child's school.

In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. All fields and especially 'Representative Experience' MUST be completed. Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.
