Firstly, I would like to welcome back all the children, staff and families of Our Lady of the Way, following the summer holidays. I sincerely hope you all had a wonderful summer. The staff and children had a lovely first couple of days. Among other things, Kinder have been learning how to sing "twinkle twinkle little star" in Japanese, Year One were demonstrating their mathematical thinking by bundling, using flip charts to represent their bundle and explaining their reasoning. Year Two were exploring choices and were using their "show me boards" to gain a group consensus of the OLOW's expectations in regard to behaviour and interactions with others. Year 3 were engaged in decoding scrambled guotes from Dr Seuss in their tribes and were demonstrating collaborative skills. Year 4 were eager to share their A to Z of OLOW, highlighting the values and practices that represent our school. Year 5 had an amazing set of examples of writing which engaged the

reader. They were also exploring the learning cycle and "the learning pit" that is a natural process when we are learning new skills. Year 6 engaged in a discussion around what leadership is and how we can be leaders at OLOW. Personally, visiting the classrooms with Miss Mizzi, was a lovely way to start the school year. I have been telling my family each night how I have had the best day ever. They do keep reminding me that I have said that every day for the last three weeks!



Each year we set goals in the areas of Formation, Mission and Religious Education, Literacy and Numeracy. We will share, in detail, specific strategies at our upcoming Information evening.

Our goals for 2019 are:

Formation, Mission and Religious Education: For students to demonstrate an enhanced engagement in the Religious Education Curriculum through the inquiry process.

Literacy: For students to improve their reading comprehension through improved self-correction rates and inferential comprehension strategies.

Numeracy: For students to show evidence of a greater understanding of mathematical tasks through developing vocabulary and the use of efficient reasoning.

Throughout the year, teachers will focus on these goals both at a school and system level. We have regular opportunities to meet with colleagues from neighbouring schools to share our progress with these goals and to receive feedback on our next steps. We are also assisted at a system level through visits from key personnel who act as "critical friends" and provide professional development opportunities for staff, including the leadership team.

We are fortunate to be part of such a dynamic, collaborative system.


FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

At the start of each year, teachers along with their students take time to get to know each other and to set class expectations to ensure a positive learning environment. At Our Lady of the Way we value this time of the year and believe it is important to build strong relationships with each other. In the past we might have had 'class rules' that all must follow or face the consequences. Today we believe in setting class expectations with the students, knowing that when they feel part of the process it is deemed to be more fair and students are more likely to work and learn within set expectations. We talk with the students about each of us having a job. Teachers have a job in the classroom and so does each student. This week, Mrs McFadzean and I have witnessed many of our grades setting up their class expectations - a great foundation for a successful year of learning.

Learning how to **RELATE**:





One of our Learning Platforms is 'Learning to Relate'. Positive relationships are key to a successful learning environment, school and overall well-being. We talk with our students about 'connecting behaviours' and 'disconnecting behaviours'. In all that we do, we aim to connect positively with others, rather than disconnecting from others.

You can talk with your children at home about how they are connecting with new (and old) friends in a positive way at school. A great phrase for the end of the day is:

"What went well today?" rather than "How was school today?"

The first phrase tends to provide a more positive response and possibly more than a simple one-word answer. Another great way to start or end the day is to talk about what you're grateful for. This helps train our brains to focus on the positive in each day and to take notice of the little things that bring us happiness.

SCHOOL FEES

Statements for the first instalment of school fees for 2019 will be mailed out during the week beginning 18th February. The due date for payment is on or before Wednesday 20th March 2019. If you have not received your statement by Monday 4th March, please contact me on 4777 7200 to arrange for a copy to be sent home.

The Flexible Payment Plan will again be offered as an option for the payment of 2019 fees. The necessary information required to take up this convenient payment alternative will be provided with your first instalment fee statement. Please note that if you wish to be included in the Flexible Payment Plan option, all paperwork needs to be returned to Catholic Education Office, Parramatta by the date specified on the form.

The Catholic Education Office is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school to arrange an appointment with the Principal to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance Form so that the school is able to conduct an accurate assessment of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

N.B. If you were on a payment arrangement for 2018 (except Flexible Payment Plan or Salary Sacrifice) it is important that you contact me when you receive your First Instalment statement so that I am aware of your intentions for 2019.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to the Catholic Education Office for actioning.


The parent helpers would be responsible for opening the shop, fulfilling orders, sorting donations of clothing, handling cash payments, and maintaining a tidy environment.

OLOW KISS & DROP ZONE Procedures Let's keep our children safe'



LOCATION ~ Troy Street, near the parish driveway

HOURS OF OPERATION ~ 8am-9:30am

PURPOSE

The Kiss & Drop Zone is for parents and carers to be able to drop off their children safely without the need to get out of the car.

RULES & PROCEDURES FOR KISS & DROP



- The Kiss & Drop sign is placed daily on Troy Street to indicate the zone and where the front of the line begins
- ❖ A staff member is on duty from 8:20 8:45 to assist during the busier time
- Cars line up along the kerbside until they reach the front of the que (on the parish driveway)
- When a car is at the front of the line, children are to get out of the car on the kerb side of the road and unassisted. The driver is to remain in the car at all times
- The process should be fast. Children should be ready to get out of the car on arrival to the front of the line with their bags and items for the day ready.
- Be respectful and courteous of other drivers and members of the community
- Follow the road rules

DON'Ts

- Drivers should not get out of their car (if a child needs assistance, please park the car)
- Don't allow children to get out of the car before reaching the front of the line
