Dear OLOW Community



On Friday 31 May 2019 our staff will be involved in a Staff Development Day, there will be no school for students on this day. During this day our staff will be working on Positive Behaviour Support for Learning (PBS4L). This is a whole school framework that actively promotes positive behaviour. It enables students to develop a clear understanding of required expectations, become responsible for their own behaviour and work together to create a positive, productive and harmonious learning community.

Research tells us that the most frequent problem behaviours encountered by teachers are low-level disruptive and disengaged behaviours. These include:

- avoiding doing schoolwork;
- disrupting the flow of the lesson;
- disengaging from classroom activities;
- talking out of turn;
- being late for class; and
- using a mobile phone inappropriately.

(Sullivan et al., 2014)

It also tells us that punishing problem behaviours (without a proactive support system) is associated with increases in anti-social behaviour:

- aggression
- vandalism,
- truancy,
- dropping-out.

(Samia Michail, 2011; Skiba & Peterson, 1999; Mayer, 1995; Mayer & Sulzar-Azaroff, 1991)

So what works best? When wellbeing and quality teaching are mutually reinforced and if students are provided with high levels of wellbeing, then they are more likely to be engaged productively with learning, it is also true that improving intellectual engagement can improve wellbeing.

NATIONAL CAPITAL EXCURSION.

Our Year 6 students recently attended an educational tour of the National Capital. While on this tour they participated in a variety of educational programs focused on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit their National Capital as part of their civics and citizenship education.
