Principal's Message



Dear Our Lady of the Way Community

In addition to our Open Classrooms for existing families last week, we also hosted school tours of our school to new families seeking enrolment for 2022. This was a wonderful opportunity to showcase all that is on offer at Our Lady of the Way and reflect on our point of difference from other schools in the area.



When I asked new visitors to the site about their impressions of the school, I was told that the feeling that they got backed up what they were hearing about OLOW out in the community. In addition to the many learning opportunities provided, they reported that the school had a "nice feel". This "feel" is something that doesn't just happen overnight or something that can just be manufactured. It takes significant effort from all stakeholders. It is reflected in how we all speak to each other, respect each other and value each other. This only occurs when the values of the school are supported by the same values as home.

Interestingly last week I had to visit a medical centre and while in the waiting room I noticed a sign that reminded patients that aggressive behaviour and abuse of any type was not acceptable. I did think at the time that this was very sad and wondered when did we arrive at this point as a society, where a warning of this unacceptable behaviour had to be highlighted by NSW Health. It is also sad that this same unacceptable behaviour is becoming part of the norm in all areas of life.

As a Catholic school we firmly believe that every individual is made in the likeness of God and requires respect and nurturing. It is not acceptable to single out individuals as targets for bullying. It is not acceptable to use aggressive and disrespectful behaviour or intimidate others. It is not acceptable to transfer blame onto others as a result of our own actions. It is not acceptable to only look at a situation from our own perspective.

I am proud that we have a community of students from a variety of cultural backgrounds. I am proud that we cater for the needs of all individuals and are inclusive of all. Are we perfect? Certainly not. We are a community that just like a family, is made up by individuals with their own unique personalities and talents. We are a community that is made up of children from the ages of 4 to 12 years of age

who are on a learning journey that will have its challenges but equally many celebrations. Just like in the family situation, we need to support each other when things don't go to plan and provide a model of what is acceptable behaviour and work together to solve the concern.

Thank you to everyone who has and continues to support the great "feel". Together we can and do achieve so much.
